Four Quadrants of Relational Discipleship

What happens during an RD Group is one of the most frequently asked questions in Relational Discipleship. As you plan your time together, the framework below is helpful to keep in mind. The four quadrants provide a pathway for you to follow that should result in a well-rounded experience for you and your disciple(s). Each quadrant contains a few potential next steps for you to consider when praying and thinking about the members of your RD Group. Planning ahead and being intentional with spending time in each of the four quadrants will help you guard against falling into comfortable routines that may not result in maturity and multiplication. Ideas of how the quadrants can be worked into typical and unique times together are provided below the chart.

I. Typical Times Together

- A. Briefly catch up on what's new in each other's lives and pray for your time together
- B. Share scripture memory verse with each other
- C. Discuss H.E.A.R. Journal entries
- D. Hold each other accountable for what God is saying to you and what you are doing about it
- E. Pray for your areas of accountability, the Pre-Christian(s) each person is trying to reach, and eventually of the 1-3 other people each person hopes to invite in to their next RD Group

II. Unique Times Together

- A. Join each other in an activity that you could do together instead of separately
- B. Get to know each other's families
- C. Serve together within the church or in the community at some point
- D. Experiment with a Care & Connect activity that you could do together with or for a Pre-Christian(s) your group has been praying will trust in Christ
- E. Plan to meet outside your typical meeting place to experience the Lord in a different way; could be a park, someone's house, etc.
